How to Register/Enrollment

Anyone 18 years or older may enroll in adult education classes. Registration is on a space-available basis and is determined at the time of enrollment. Selected classes will require an assessment and orientation session prior to registering. The following priorities are used if more are interested in enrolling than can be accommodated: 1) adults residing in the district; 2) adults residing in other districts. Enroll in person at our Erwin Campus main office, or register online for selected classes at www.bassettadultschool.com

Registration & Instructional Material Fees

Registration fees can only be taken in cash. Please bring exact change. Some classes may require additional fee for instructional materials.

Purchase of Textbooks

Books may be purchased on line at www.bassett.textbookx.com or www.cengagebrain.com/micro/bassettesl

Class Size

Classes, which do not meet the 18 student minimum requirement, may be canceled.

Childcare/Babysitting

Childcare is available for Bassett Adult School students only while attending class. Childcare is available Monday through Thursday at no cost to the student. Child must be potty trained.

Insurance

Bassett Adult School does not carry accident insurance for students nor for the children of the students.

Discrimination Policy

Bassett Adult School, in compliance with civil rights legislation, hereby asserts that it does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, ancestry, religion, creed, sex, age, or handicap in its employment or enrollment in any education program.

Dress Code

Students are encouraged to dress comfortably. Shoes and shirt are required. Inappropriate dress includes: clothing marked with profane

or suggestive language, clothing marked with sexual, racial or ethnic slurs, gang clothing or any clothing which exposes private areas of the body. Caps are permitted outside of the classroom. Students violating the dress code will be asked to leave and return dressed appropriately.

District Computer Usage Policy

Sexual Harassment

Refund Policy

Bassett Adult School has a fair and equitable refund policy for the refund of tuition fees in the event that the class is canceled or the student does not plan to attend. The following procedures are established as part of this policy:

- 1. Registration fees are non-refundable.
- 2. Refunds for classes or programs canceled by Bassett Adult School: If fees are collected in advance of the start date of the program, 100 percent of the fees collected will be refunded

within 45 days of the planned start date of the class or program canceled. No written notice by student is required.

- **3.** Refunds for students who withdraw on or before the first day of class: if fees are collected in advance of the start date of a program, and the student does not begin class or withdraws on the first day of the class, the fees collected will be refunded, less a \$25 drop fee.
- **4.** Refunds for student enrolled prior to visiting the institution: students who have not visited Bassett Adult School campus prior to enrollment will have the opportunity to withdraw without penalty within three days following attendance at the regularly scheduled orientation or following a tour of the facilities and inspection of the equipment.
- **5.** Refunds for withdrawal after class commences: No refund after second class session.
- **6.** Receipt is required for all refunds. Policy is in alignment with our Accrediting Association and/or U.S. Department of Education standards.

HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA INFORMATION

REGISTRATION INFORMATION FOR HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA & ADULT BASIC EDUCATION (ABE)

Bassett Adult School may grant credit for a high school diploma for successful completion of adult classes. A total of 180 credits and proficiency tests are required. Candidates may receive credit for military service, previous schooling, recognized correspondence schools and standardized achievement tests. Counselor is available to discuss college entrance requirements. College Financial Aid information for Bassett graduates is available. Call (626) 931-3106 for information.

Steps to follow:

- **1.** New students and returning students, take the High School Diploma placement test.
- *Students with disabilities who may need special accommodations to take the placement test should make arrangements with the counselor.
- **2.** Students who are reenrolling from a previous year do not need to take the test.
- **3.** After testing, student will be placed in a High School Diploma or Adult Basic Education (ABE) class determined by level of proficiency

(score of 24 or above in High School program, score 23 or below, in Adult Basic Education program).

- 4. High School Diploma Program students:
- Schedule an appointment with the counselor
- Obtain official sealed transcripts from last high school attended
- New attendees or Bassett Adult School students must have completed ESL Level 5/6 & CASAS score of 235 and above, or scored 24 or above on the High School Diploma placement test.

Residence Requirements: A minimum of ten units must be completed at BAS for diploma.

Special Note: BAS will grant the High School Diploma to students who have completed all high school credits. The counselor will notify students if there is any change in state law of the requirements for graduation.

TECHNICAL CAREERS TRAINING

ELECTRICIAN CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

Existing law requires that persons performing work as electrician under a C 10 licensed electrical contractor be certified pursuant to certification standards established by the Division of Labor Standards Enforcement. "Electrician is defined as all persons who engage in the connection of electrical devices for the electrical contractors.

Bassett Adult School (#0169) is approved by the State of California Department of Industrial Relations to offer Whole General Electrician Curriculum. Students may apply for an Electrician Trainee Card (T-Card) upon verification of enrollment and attendance of any module. Bassett Adult School has various modules available each teaching a different topic. Student can seek employment after obtaining their T-card but typically student will wait until the second module. The modules are as follow:

ELECTRICIAN TRAINEE #1 (234 HOURS) | BASIC ELECTRICITY/TOOLS / METERS/SAFETY AND NEC 2014

ELECTRICIAN TRAINEE #2 (234 HOURS) | RESIDENTIAL WIRING

ELECTRICIAN TRAINEE #3 (234 HOURS) | COMMERCIAL WIRING / INDUSTRIAL WIRING

ELECTRICIAN TRAINEE #4 (234 HOURS) | MOTOR CONTROLS

Upon completing the electrical training program at Bassett Adult School a graduate will acquire the following skills:

- Be competent in reading, understanding and applying the requirements of the National Electrical Code to residential, commercial and industrial installations.
- Be able to read residential, commercial and industrial blueprints.
- Understand and be competent in the use of digital multi-meters, clamp on multi-meters, Meg-ohmmeters, Phase sequence and motor rotation meters, ground resistance meters, harmonics and power analyzer meters.
- Have journeyman level skill in bending conduit.
- Be able to properly size and install electrical circuits using Romex, AC and MC cables, flexible metal conduit, electrical nonmetallic tubing, liquidtite flexible nonmetallic conduit, liquidtite flexible metallic conduit, electrical metallic tubing.
- Be able to select and install residential, commercial and industrial power distribution systems.
- Have a thorough understanding of grounding and bonding requirements including touch and step potentials, equal potential ground protection, static protection and cathodic protection.
- Be able to select and install proper overcurrent protection achieving correct coordination and selective.
- Be able to properly size copper, aluminum and copper clad aluminum conductors.
- Thoroughly understand and be able to install lighting system and controls fully compliant with current Title 24
 regulations for residential, commercial and industrial systems.
- Be able to specify, select, install commission and troubleshoot AC and DC motors and recognize the common
 power transmission gears, sprockets and pulleys used in commercial and industrial facilities.
- Be able to select, install and commission Variable speed drives and Variable frequency drives.
- Develop a thorough understanding of control logic, diagrams and devices.
- Have a comprehensive knowledge of photoelectric and proximity sensors.
- Have the ability to program smart relays, wire and install electric braking and dynamic braking systems.
- Be fully able to troubleshoot in a timely manner all the systems listed above.
- Have a thorough understanding of safety including general construction safety, ladders, fall protection, lock out tag out, arc flash hazards and personal protection equipment.

TECHNICAL CAREERS TRAINING

HEATING VENTILATION AND AIR CONDITIONING (HVAC) – 306 HOURS

This course is **short term vocational training** designed to prepare the student in the basic fundamentals of refrigeration and air conditioning. Students will learn to diagnose service, install and repair residential and commercial refrigeration and air conditioning equipment. Students will learn safety, basic tools and the use of diagnostic instruments used in the field. Students will also prepare and test for an EPA 608 Universal Certification. Instructor is a certified professional HVAC technician working for Bassett Unified School District, so many of our field trips will be local with actual running equipment. This course is also articulated with Mt San Antonio College HVAC department for students that wish to pursue higher education in the rewarding career of refrigeration and air conditioning.

PRIVATE SECURITY TRAINING

Security is one of the fastest growing industries in the State of California. The Security Academy Curriculum at Bassett Adult School is short term training designed and focused on preparing the student for a career in Private Security. Instructors are all former law enforcement officers with an extensive amount of experience. All classes listed are credentialed by BSIS (Bureau of Security and Investigative Services).

ADVANCED PRIVATE SECURITY (128 HOURS)

This program provides a comprehensive knowledge to perform the basic duties of a private security guard. Students obtain the BSIS permits for security guard, baton permit, O/C pepper spray, firearms permits, use of force, arrest search and seizure, weaponless defense, civil liability, CPR/First aid and much more to perform the duties of an entry level private security guard.


