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




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What do the CCR Standards consist of?

The CCR Standards have four major strands: **reading**, **writing**, **speaking and listening**, **and language**. Each strand has several **anchor** standards. Each anchor standard has **level-specific standards**.








Sample Standard From the Reading Strand

Anchor 1: Read closely to determine what the text says explicitly and to make logical inferences from it; cite specific textual evidence when writing or speaking to support conclusions drawn from the text.









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


CCR: Three Instructional Shifts

CCR Standards Focus on Literacy Instruction (ELA Literacy)

Three key areas of shift in emphasis:

- ✓ Complexity: Texts are more complex, use more academic language and vocabulary
- **√** Evidence:
 - Reading—cite evidence, analyze information
 - Writing—conduct research, analyze sources
 - Speaking/listening—use academic talk based on readings
- √ Knowledge: Students read across disciplines (nonfictional texts);
 students read informational texts to develop content knowledge




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




Academic Language to Cite Evidence: Respond to Text-Dependent Questions by Citing Evidence From the Text








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Wages & Employment Trends
